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DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS FOR VERTEBROPLASTY OR VERTEBRAL AUGMENTATION/KYPHOPLASTY

Congratulations! You have undergone a "minimally invasive" technique of repairing your compression fracture called Vertebroplasty. Because this technique is much less invasive than other surgical techniques, you should have much less pain, require much less pain medicine, and return to your normal activities much faster than usual. However, although this technique has all these benefits, it is still a surgical procedure, and certain precautions should be followed your surgery. The list below is intended to help you understand what you should and should not do before and after surgery.

SEDATION

- The sedation you received for your procedure is still in your system. Therefore, we would like you to take it easy the rest of the day and evening. We recommend that your caregiver remains with you for the remainder of the day.
- Do not drive and avoid drinking alcohol. Do not sign important documents or make legal decisions for the next 24 hours.

AFTER SURGERY:

- *Use your prescribed pain medication, muscle relaxers, as directed.
- *Please resume all of your prescription medications as previously prescribed.
- *You have NO stitches to remove. Small bandages are on your incision. These can be removed in 24 hours.
- *Do not soak in a bathtub or shower for 24 hours.
- *Do not do any heavy lifting for 3 months. After that you can gradually increase your lifting to normal.
- *Watch for signs of fever, chills, warmth, redness, numbness, or an increase in drainage from your incision.
- ***Please notify us if you experience an increase in pain after your procedure.
